CHERRY RIDGE

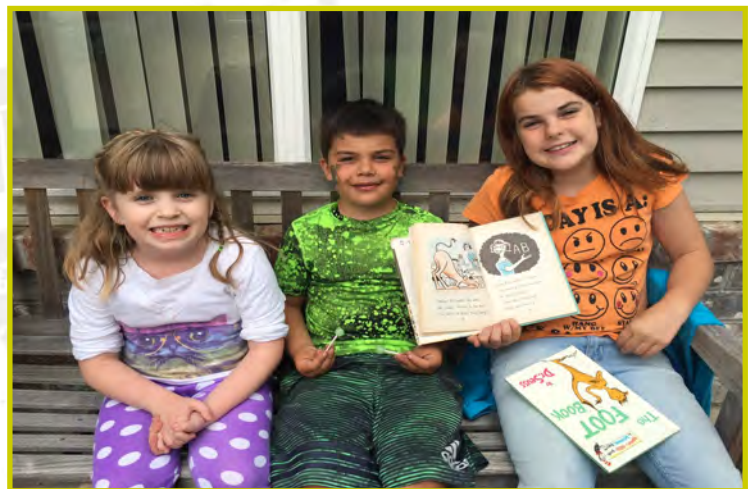
